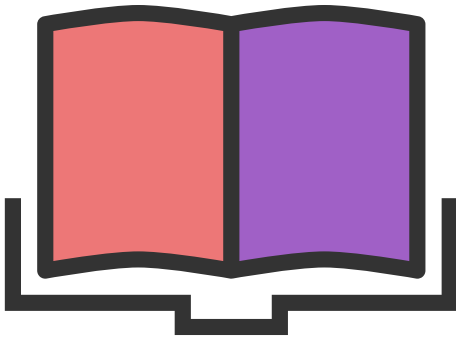

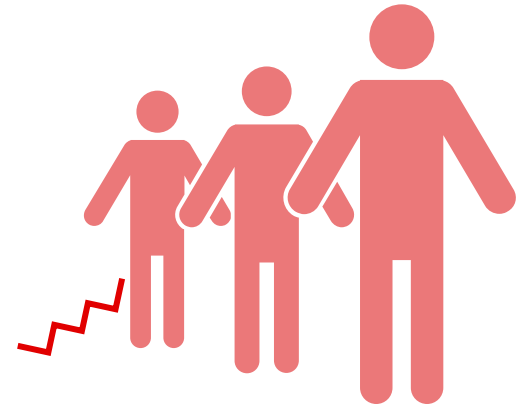

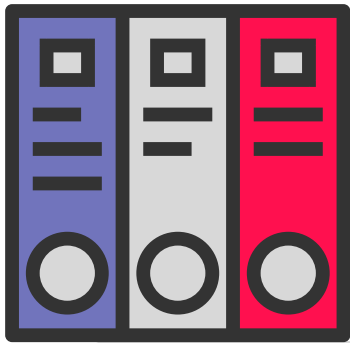
During the pandemic in 2021

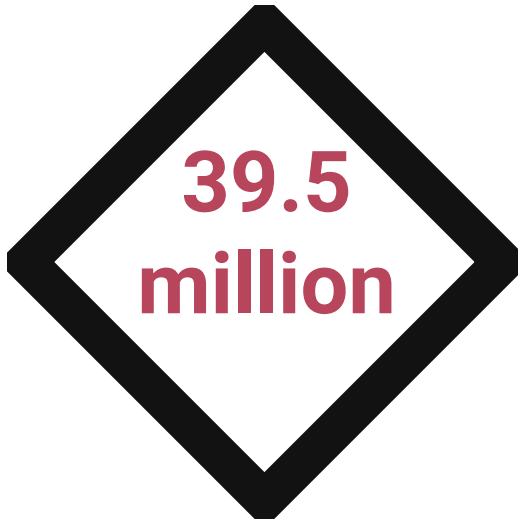

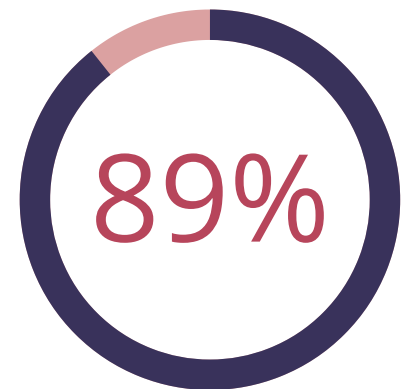

Experts estimate that there are 67,408 public primary schools in the US. Moreover, there are only about 20,090 private schools in the country (NCES, 2020).

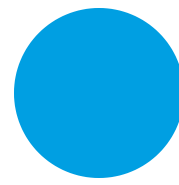

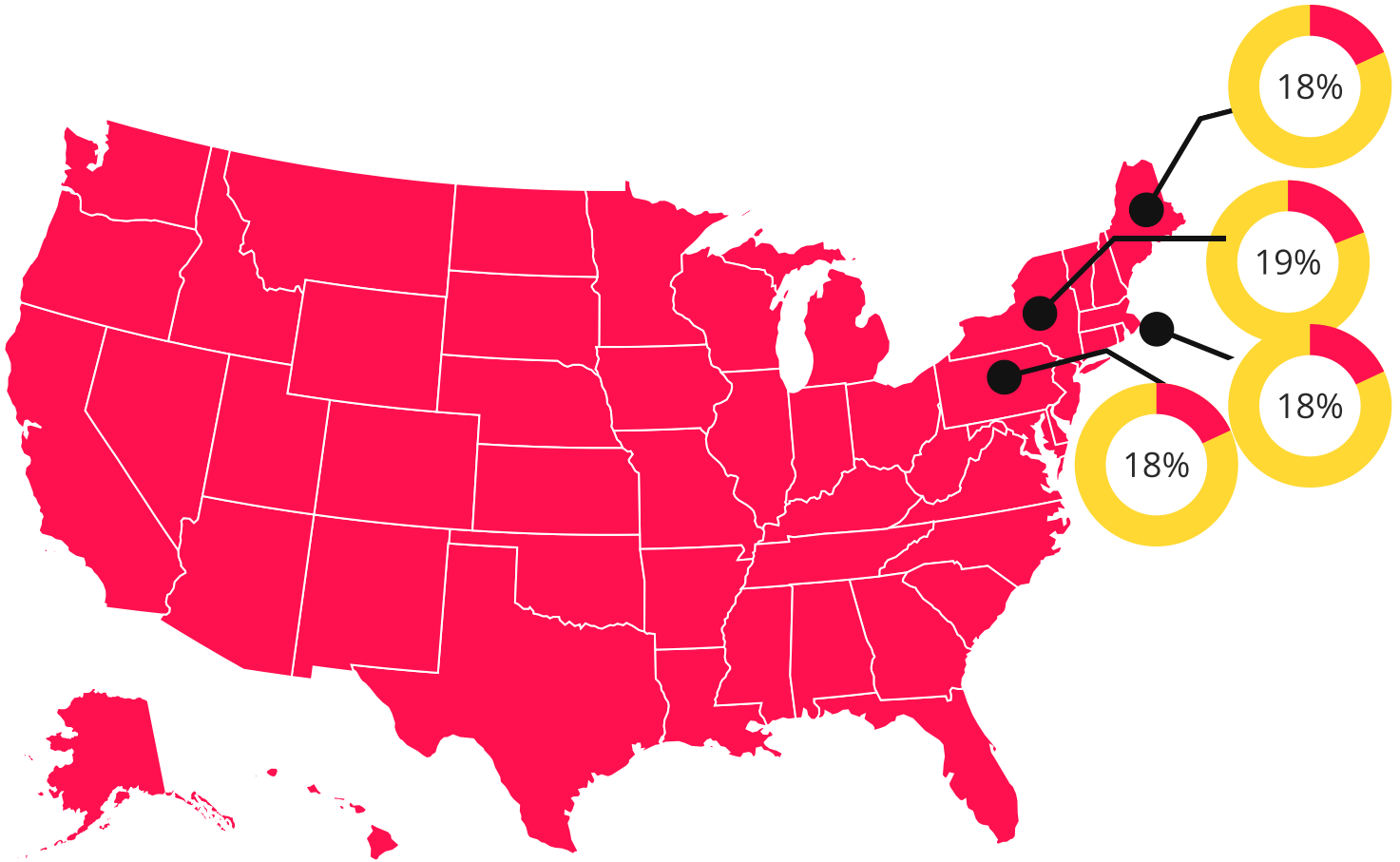

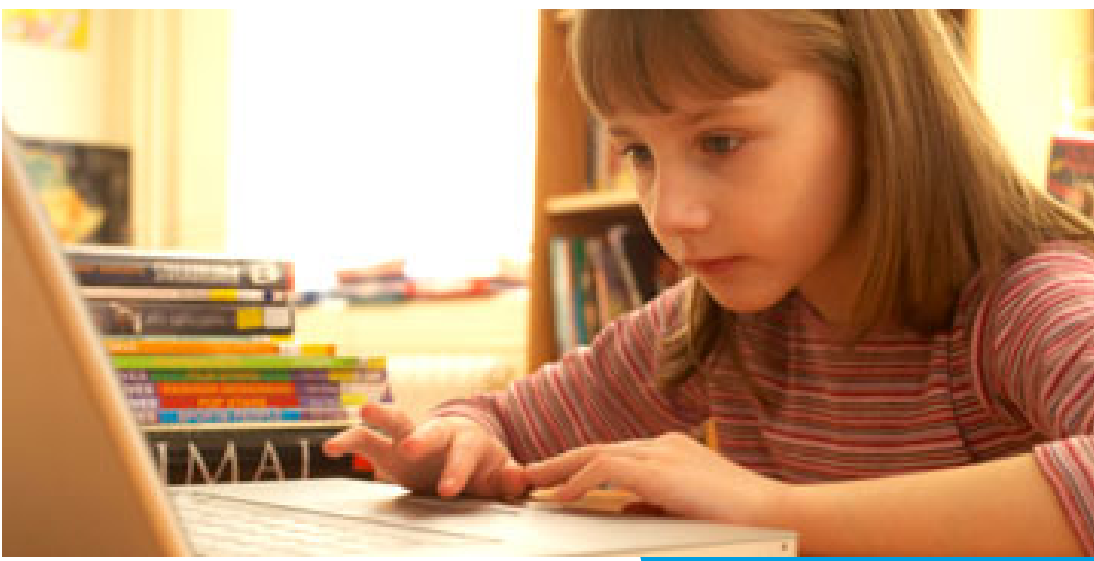
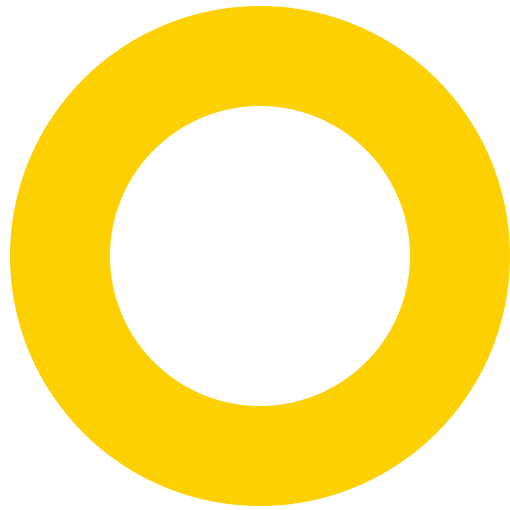


General Special Ed Statistics in US



New York State has the largest share of disabled students, followed by Pennsylvania, Maine, and Massachusetts (Pew Research, 2020).





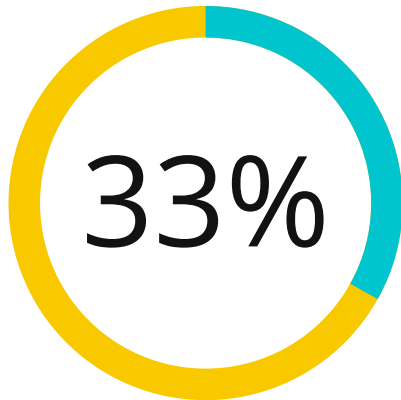
From 2011 to 2019

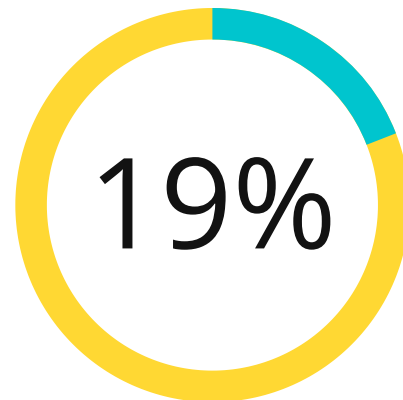

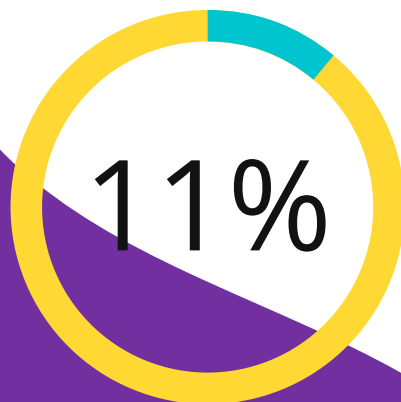

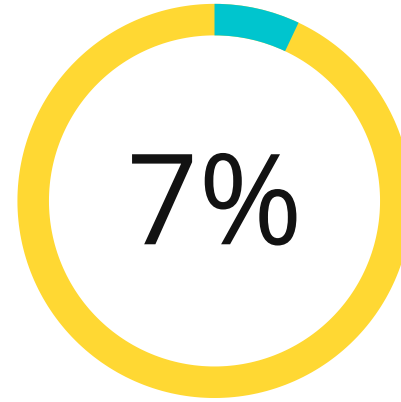
