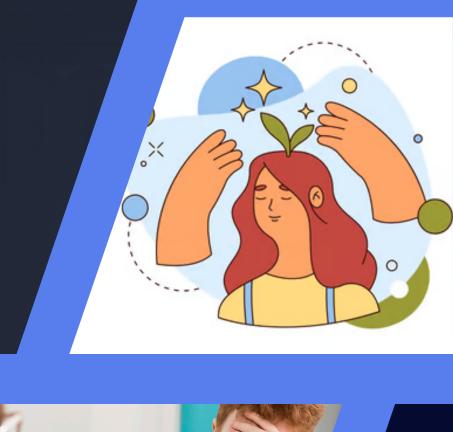


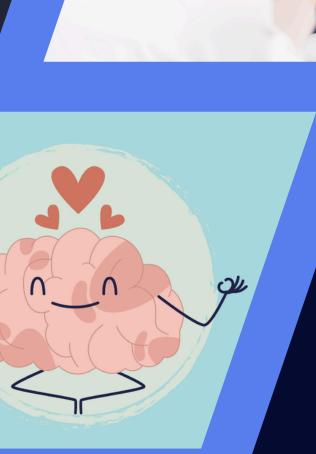
Mental Health program

The CDC's ADDM Network reports a prevalence of 1 in 31 children aged 8 years (about 3.2%)

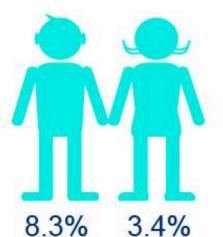
The rise in reported cases is largely due to improved diagnostic tools, broader awareness, and expanded screening—not necessarily an actual increase in autism prevalence

of school aged children were 5.9% recorded with an autism diagnosis in 2024/25

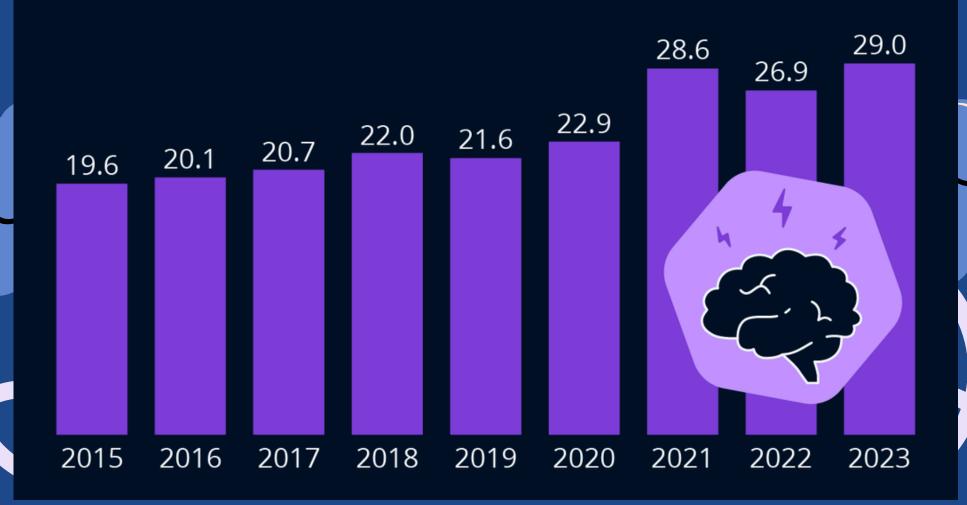


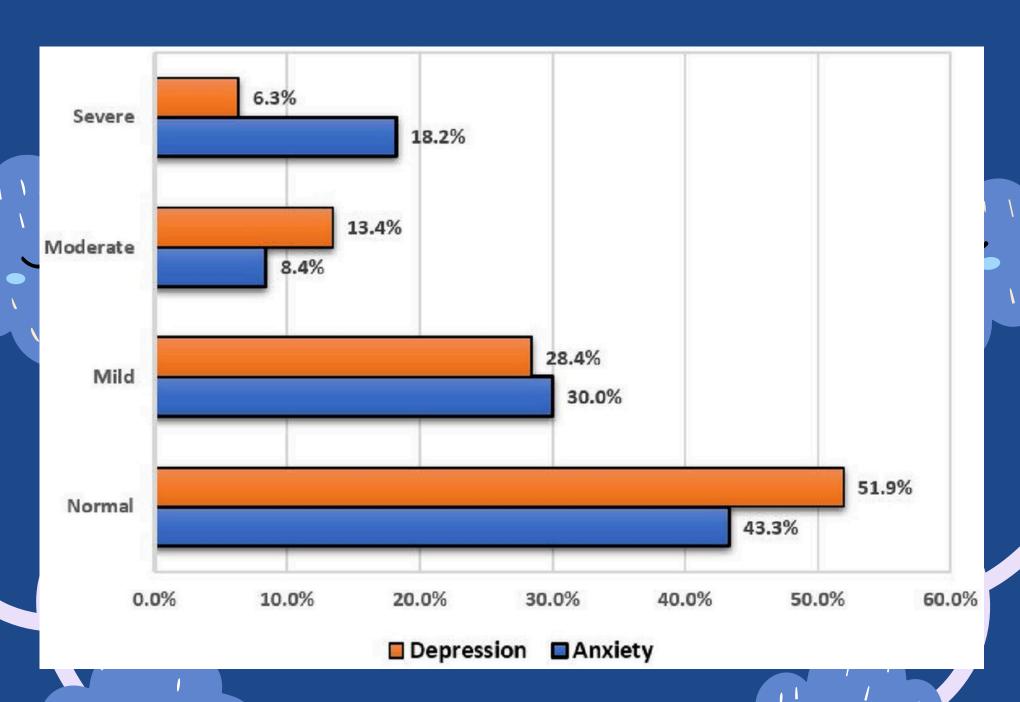

2024 highlights include expanding the ethical use of AI, digital tools, and e-learning platforms to enhance teaching and learning experiences worldwide while ensuring accessibility and equity.

According to the 2024 Condition of Education Report from the National Center for Education Statistics (NCES), in the 2021–22 school year, the adjusted cohort graduation rate (ACGR) for public high school students in the U.S. was 87%, representing an increase of 7 percentage points compared to a decade ago.

Let's Support the Children is dedicated to promoting mental health and well-being among children in public schools through comprehensive support programs, advocacy, and awareness campaigns

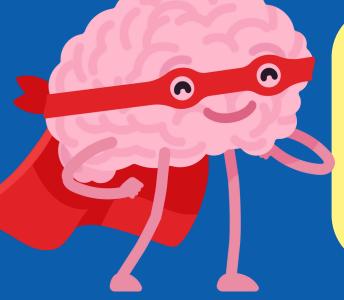
